

Pennsylvania History, Beginnings to 1865

1640 BEFORE 1638 Native Americans are the only people in Pennsylvania.

1638 Swedish and Finnish colonists are the first Europeans in the area.

1655 Dutch take control of New Sweden.

1674 The English take control of Pennsylvania.

1681-1682 William Penn establishes Pennsylvania as a haven for Quakers and other persecuted religious groups. Philadelphia is founded.

1700 Delaware separates from Pennsylvania.

1720 Delaware separates from Pennsylvania.

1740 1737 The Walking Purchase expands White settlement in the area.

1750 1751 Liberty Bell is brought to Pennsylvania.

1770 1763-1767 Charles Mason and Jeremiah Dixon draw Mason-Dixon line between Pennsylvania and Maryland. It later became a boundary between states with and without slavery.

1790 1776 United States Declaration of Independence is signed in Philadelphia.

1810 1787 The U.S. Constitution is written at the Constitutional Convention at Independence Hall.

1830 1790-1800 Philadelphia is the capital of the United States.

1850 1844 William Still moves to Philadelphia and begins working with the Pennsylvania Society for the Abolition of Slavery.

1870 1863 Battle of Gettysburg is a Union victory. Abraham Lincoln gives the Gettysburg Address.
