The Revolutionary War

1760 1765 1770 1775 1780 1785 1790


- 1765 Patrick Henry leads opposition to Stamp Act.
- 1770 Boston Massacre
- 1774 First Continental Congress meets to resist unfair British laws.
- 1776 Patriots drive British from Boston.
- SEPT. 1777 British occupy Philadelphia.
- 1780 British occupy Charles Town.
- Oct. 1781 British surrender at Yorktown.



Expanding in the 1800s

1800 1810 1820 1830 1840 1850 1860 1870

- 1807 The steamboat was invented by Robert Fulton.
- 1825 Erie Canal completed.
- 1854 Children's Aid Society created the Orphan Train Movement.
- 1840-1860 Approximately 30,000 miles of railroad tracks were built.



Abolitionism

- 1787 New York African Free School is founded.
- 1799 All Black people born in New York after July 4 will be free by their 25th or 28th birthday.
- 1844 Sojourner Truth begins her anti-slavery campaign.
- 1849 Abolitionist William Seward is elected U.S. Senator.






Venn Diagram
